#### A Report from Advent and Lent

Friends in Faith,



Over the years we have encouraged spiritual reflection in Advent and Lent by printing devotions written by OPC members or by printing other's devotionals or by citing links to them. Both Princeton and Pittsburgh Seminaries publish thoughtful reflections for these penitential seasons.

This liturgical year my heart and mind (or was it the Spirit?) led me in a different direction. Last December, I began with one promising book. However, after muddling through the first chapters, I realized that it was not speaking to me. I returned to a book I had previously begun, The Collected Sermons of David Bartlett. The Rev. Dr. Bartlett was the J. Edward and Ruth Cox Lantz Professor Emeritus of Christian Communication at Yale Divinity School and Distinguished Professor Emeritus of New Testament at Columbia Theological Seminary. He was also an American Baptist Pastor.

What I found so nurturing in this book was how the Rev. Dr. Bartlett had one foot in worldliness with all its challenges and humanity and one foot firmly resting in faith. Included were a series of sermons on "On Being a Christian" and a series on "Great Words of Faith" like *incarnation* and *salvation*. Bartlett, now deceased, was clearly bright and humble and faithful. These 52 sermons include thoughtful reflections, new insights and encouragements in faith.

My devotional choice for Lent was a brand-new book by the Distinguished Professor Emeritus from Duke Divinity School, Richard Lischer. His book's title, <u>Our Hearts Are Restless</u>, has the somewhat misleading subtitle "The Art of Spiritual Memoir". I was drawn to this book by a reviewer who wrote, "Lischer has a storyteller's genius, a pastor's instinct for emotional authenticity, a preacher's eye for tracing gospel truth, a scholar's skill at critical inquiry, and a Christian understanding of love and suffering."

The book has not disappointed me. In 21 chapters Lischer reviews the memoirs (or other writings) of well-known Christians like Augustine of Hippo, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Julian of Norwich, Emily Dickinson, Thomas Merton and Dorothy Day as well as some lesser-known Christians. Each chapter serves as an introduction to these notable followers of Christ along with a critical review of their writings. Reading this book was both a review of some history I know and discoveries of new information and spiritual insights.

My reading in Advent and Lent, 1) held my interest and 2) led me to think more about the Christian faith and my faith. Some years in the future I will likely be led to address some particular weakness in my life or in my faith, but, in these last two meditative seasons, my reading cultivated and fertilized the ground of my faith.

There are considerable resources for Christians that are profitable to read. Such writings may be found in Christian periodicals, reviewed in the secular press, or referenced by the fine speakers in our adult education classes. One vastly underutilized resource for spiritual reading is our own Steve Crocco who was the head librarian at Pittsburgh and Princeton Seminaries and at Yale Divinity School. Do you have a subject you would like to explore and need a reference? Call Steve Crocco.

Now, what to read this summer?


