Dear Friends,

A writer once penned these words: "We spend eighty percent of our mental energy thinking about the past or future, and only twenty percent thinking about the present." When I heard those words, I immediately remembered sitting in professor Dale Bowne's Greek class as a sophomore at Grove City College. Teaching young minds the complexities and idiosyncrasies of a new language, he said, "You should know that the Greek language has two words for time: chronos and kairos. Chronos means time, how we measure time, past, present and future. Kairos means 'the right time."

Certainly, the members and friends of the Oakmont Presbyterian Church are thinking about 'chronos' these days. With the retirement of Rev. Steve Wilson, you are thinking about the three and a half decades of his ministry; what you have accomplished together, how you have grown, how 'the two became one,' literally, with the merger of Riverside and Oakmont Presbyterian churches. Relationships deepened, marriages were performed, funerals were conducted, and generations passed through these doors. God was good, and God is good!

At this point in the church's history, I also want to encourage you to think of 'kairos' time, the right time. All the great events of the gospels occur in the fullness of time : "When the time for Elizabeth had become full she bore her son John" (Luke 1:57). "The time has come to its fullness and the kingdom of God is close at hand" (Mark 1:15). "When the time had come to completion, God sent his Son, born of a woman" (Gal. 4:4), and in the fullness of time God will "bring everything together under Christ, as head, everything in the heavens and everything on earth." (Eph. 1:10). This is a kairos moment in the life of Oakmont Presbyterian, the 'right time.' Something has ended, and we are not certain what the future holds. Now is the 'kairos' to pray, to work, to anticipate the movement of God in this place, and to dream.

What will God do in the coming months? One thing we know for sure: God has been with us in the past and will lead us into the future! I'm excited to be with you as your interim pastor, and look forward to meeting with you, working with you, and praying with you for the future of Oakmont Presbyterian. This is an interesting time in the history of the church. It is the right time, a time to work with anticipation and to dream of where God is leading this church.


