Dear Friends,

Years ago, our daughter decided to attend a college 565.8 miles from home, in Greenville, Illinois. When we dropped her off in August of 2007, we knew she would not be home again until Thanksgiving. When we picked her up at the airport in mid-November it was a grand reunion. She talked all the way home, sharing stories and bubbling with excitement. As we walked up the steps from our basement carrying luggage, my daughter froze three steps from the top. In the three months since she'd been gone, we had purchased a new kitchen table. She pointed at it and said, "What is that?!" When we explained that it was, obviously, a new kitchen table she said, "You shouldn't be making changes like that without asking me!"

We all act differently when faced with change. Some face into the future, excited about what might be possible, and some hold onto the kitchen table and say, "Leave it right where it is!" I don't know how you react to change but I do know we live in a world that is constantly changing, and the speed with which it changes has accelerated. It took Thomas Jefferson two weeks to travel from Philadelphia, America's then capital, to his estate in Monticello at the turn of the nineteenth century. By 1850, the same journey could be done by steam train in one day. In Fortune magazine's first issue, February 1930, it reported that 94 percent of all passenger cars in Japan were made in America. In 1971, the first-generation Intel processor had 2,300 transistors. Today, a single microchip can have a transistor count in the billions. Who knows what the future will hold? Organizational consultant Warren Bennis once famously observed that the "factory of the future will have only two employees, a man and a dog. The man will be there to feed the dog. The dog will be there to keep the man from touching the equipment."

We all know that Oakmont Presbyterian Church is changing. Pastor Steve has been retired for over half a year now. I've been the Interim pastor now for just as long. As you may know, when I accepted the call back in September, I signed a one-year contract that would run through September of 2024. **At the end of the worship service on April 7, I announced to the congregation that I would be re-retiring as of September 30.** My time here has been wonderful. This church has a long and important history and I am certain that the future of Oakmont Presbyterian Church is bright. The gifts of the people, the presence of the Holy Spirit and the possibilities of the future all point to the fact that God has plans for this church!

The Interim Pastoral Nominating Committee has already been meeting and they will be searching for a 'Bridge Pastor'; one who will serve for 6 months, if needed. The Pastoral Nominating Committee has also begun meeting, searching for that new pastor that will lead us into the future.

In 1577 English Explorer Sir Francis Drake penned the following prayer which I present for our use in the coming months: "Disturb us, Lord, to dare more boldly, to venture on wider seas where storms show your mastery; where losing sight of land, we shall find the stars. We ask you to push back the horizons of our hopes; and to push into the future in strength, courage, hope, and love."



Religious Extremism: What's It About?

Perhaps the easiest way to denounce a religion, a movement, or a political party today is to label it “extreme” and its practitioners as “extremists.” After considering what might count as “religious extremism,” this Adult Ed class will consider three examples: Islamicism (Islamic fundamentalism), White Christian Nationalism, and a lesser-known movement of the Religious Left that can be called “Identitarian Religious Globalism,” which can include religious supporters of Hamas. After the three sessions, you will be able to approach the fall election season with some new questions, better definitions, and a dose of skepticism.
