#### Dear Friends,

Summer is my favorite time of the year. Ever since that June day in 1966 when I heard the loud ring of the school bell announcing the end of first grade (!) and the freedom of summer, I've been captivated by the sun, the ocean, the flowers, baseball, fireflies, swimming pools and cool nights playing hide and seek at dusk. Fifty-eight summers later, the joy, freedom and delight of summer still captivate me, though I don't play hide and seek with the same regularity anymore. There's just something about summer: the beauty, the freedom and the slower pace of life. It may sound strange for a pastor to say this, but I enjoy the slower season of summer in the church. There are fewer meetings, fewer activities, and earlier church services that allow us to make the most of a summer Sunday. Yes, it's true, there are fewer people in the pews, too, but that means many of us are creating memories and refreshing our bodies and souls. Many of you are traveling and you wholeheartedly agree with the English Essayist William Hazlitt who said, "I would like to spend the whole of my life traveling, if I could anywhere borrow another life to spend at home." Summer is a sacred season, God's gift.

I hope you'll enjoy God's gift each and every day of this season. Travel and return home and tell us what you've seen and experienced. Lounge by the pool (but don't the SPF 50 sunscreen!). Sit on the porch or deck as the sun slowly slides out of view...and maybe read and meditate on some of God's Word (here are some verses that highlight the beauty of God's creation: Job 12:7-10; Psalm 96:10-13; Psalm 19:1-6; Romans 1:20; Genesis 1:21; Isaiah 42:5; Revelation 5:13). And, of course, join us in worship when you are in town!

I leave you with these words of poet Mary Oliver, who saw the hand of God in all that lives:

Who made the world? Who made the swan, and the black bear? Who made the grasshopper? This grasshopper, I meanthe one who has flung herself out of the grass, the one who is eating sugar out of my hand, who is moving her jaws back and forth instead of up and downwho is gazing around with her enormous and complicated eyes. Now she lifts her pale forearms and thoroughly washes her face. Now she snaps her wings open, and floats away. I don't know exactly what a prayer is. I do know how to pay attention, how to fall down into the grass, how to kneel down in the grass, how to be idle and blessed, how to stroll through the fields, which is what I have been doing all day. Tell me, what else should I have done? Doesn't everything die at last, and too soon? Tell me, what is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious life? —Mary Oliver
